

TECHNICAL NEEDS – ROB BIAGI CONCERT

Note from Rob: Hello! We could NOT do this event without your support and direction, so thanks in advance for helping me learn your system so we can make this a great event for the kids.

Basic Tech Needs for a Rob Biagi Tracks Accompaniment Gig:

- Rob will sing live over pre-recorded background music (laptop to be controlled at FOH)
- Hopefully the venue has:
 - a good-sounding mixing board > power amp > speaker system
 - enough power-amperage to fill the space with 95db+ of good quality sound
 - Video projector(s) and screen(s) to project lyrics and graphic images
- Even though it's a "Performance Tracks" gig, you'll need to do an "active" mix (Rob's vocal will need to be made louder, reverb & delay turned on and off, etc.)
- Rob will bring:
 - o a wireless headworn microphone
 - wireless transmitter
 - o wireless receiver (to be plugged in at the stage), and
 - XLR cables for the above gear
- Rob will bring his Mac laptop, VGA adapter, 1/8" cable, and stereo direct box
- Rob would like 1 wireless hand-held microphone for the emcee and for interacting with the kids
- 2 Stage Monitors (wedges) at front edge of stage would be nice, so Rob (and his family or other backup dancers) can hear the music and vocal.
- Rob will want to plug his "in-ear" monitors (Shure PSMs) into an aux channel at the stage

Other Considerations:

Volume Level During the Concert/Event

The volume will need to be 95db+ if it sounds good. We want a "good, energetic loud" (as opposed to a nasty, hurtful, damaging loud. I'll bring my SPL/db meter and you probably have one too.) It will seem too loud at soundcheck, but once the kids are all there makin' noise, it'll be right ©

Space on the Stage

Please allow space on the stage for us to do dance moves. (10' deep and 25' wide is preferred).

Space in Front of the Stage for the Kids

Rob will invite the kids to the front area below the stage to sing and do the dance moves along with him. *If possible*, please have someone remove 3-4 rows of chairs to make room for them! Thanks.

Please call Rob directly at (949) 395-8655 to briefly discuss your p.a. system (make/model of speakers, how they're "flying", "natural reverb" issues, and other things we should know before we get there.
